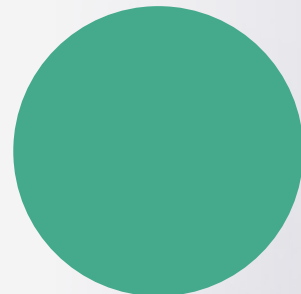

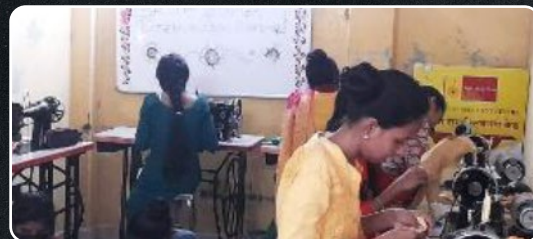

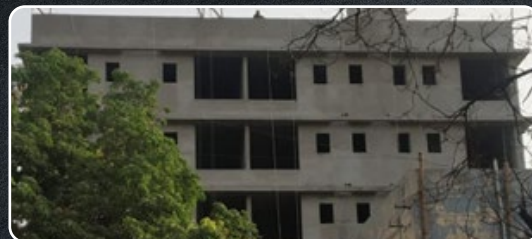

## CASE STUDY:

### Adopted Learning Methodology:

# "Story of Enlightenment"

With ever-changing new dimensions, we have witnessed that experiential learning is the best method of education. On those lines, a Vijaynagar zilla parishad school in district Satara was supported in developing a kitchen garden spread over 400 sq. ft in the school premises.

Healthy eating starts with an understanding of fruits and vegetables. This school has indeed turned that in a learning experience for its students. More than 10 varieties of fruits, vegetables and shrubs, that provide not only learning but nutrition to children in their meals, were made available to students.

More than 50 children and their parents participated in the development of this kitchen garden. Parents helped in levelling the land, extending water support and upkeep of the garden.

Currently, the children are benefiting from the yield of brinjals, tomatoes, chillies, fenugreek, and spinach — all used for mid-day meals. This project has brought respite to the isolated villages in the area and is providing nutrition and hands-on learning to children.

Navneet Foundation provided 1,126 books at the regional library that stands out as a major advantage for tribal and underprivileged students preparing for the government entrance exams. Taking this a notch higher, in three villages we have set up a box library for and by the children. These kids not only learn from the world of books but also manage the library with full onus. About 90 children access these books to enhance their reading and language skills.

The scholars supported by the Foundation have indeed helped in raising the bar of excellence by exploring and leading all different education verticals.



At Navneet Foundation, we strongly believe in the idea that every child is special and can do wonders in painting the world with their own colours. Around 34 girls with special needs were provided with full day meals. The foundation has set up a kitchen garden that enables them to have a live learning experience along with the science of plants and nutrition. Early detection camps were organised for such children, providing a platform for their families to enhance early development of children.





## An Initiative of Teachers' Training Program

Last year, 'NavDisha' was launched to facilitate the teachers in meeting the challenges of the new learning and teaching situations during the pandemic phase. The Foundation facilitated webinars and online trainings that empowered the teachers by providing information about changing government resolutions and policies/updates impacting schools.

This year, the Foundation moved a mile ahead to empower the teaching community by constantly updating the NavDisha portal with current affairs and the changing regulation in the education system. NavDisha aims to be the one-stop solution for all the regulatory updates in the education system.

During the Corona period, there were numerous difficulties faced while imparting education. To face this challenging situation, Navneet Foundation had taken initiative called "Bridging the Gap" for students of grades 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. Teachers were provided subject wise online guidance by the experts, to help them conduct revision sessions for their students as schools were shut down due to the pandemic. Navneet Foundation conducted an online webinar on the 'Effects of COVID-19 on Mental and Emotional Health of Students'. This webinar helped the parents understand the mental and emotional situation of their children.

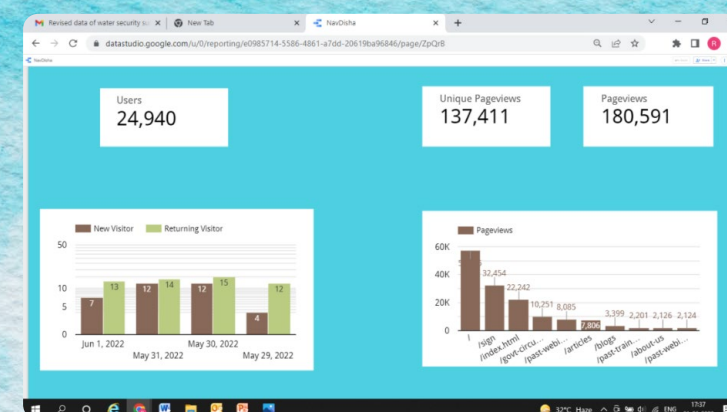
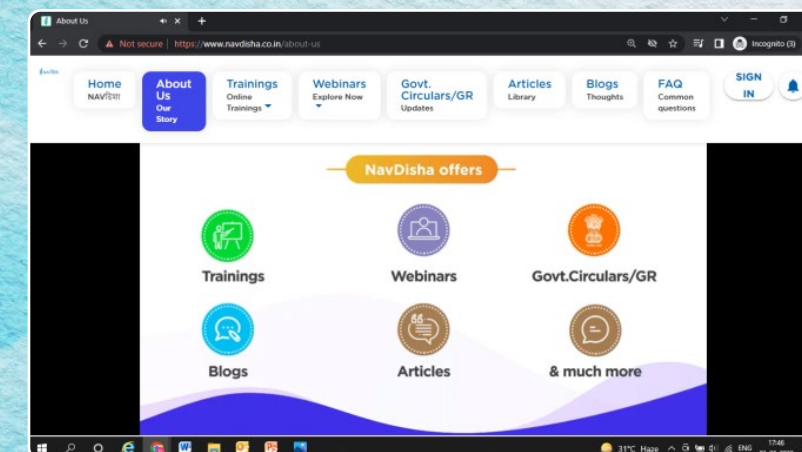

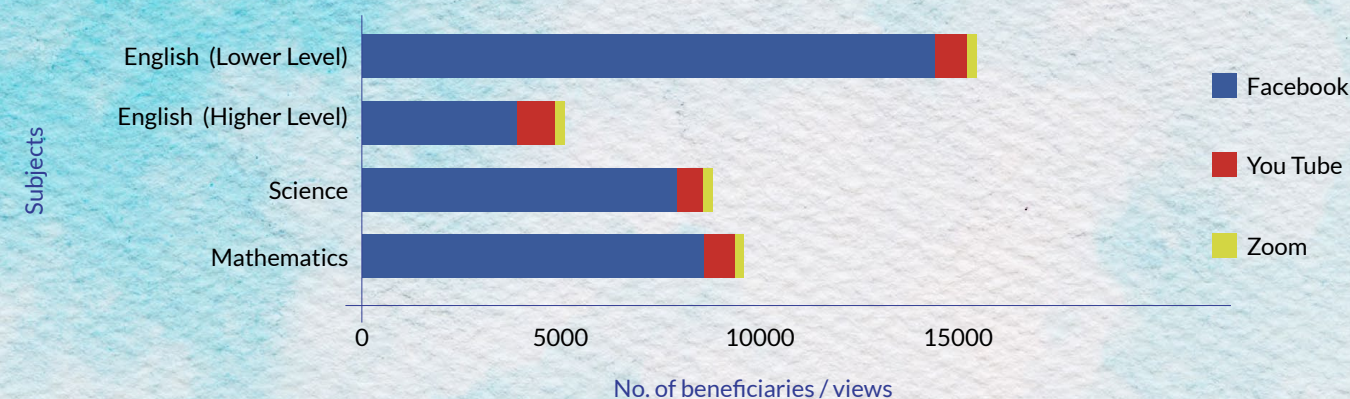

# Women Empowerment

Jyoti Prajapati, a student at Jeevan Asha Community Center in Cuff Parade, engaged in the course on essential sewing and tailoring in 2020. She has become highly proficient at the craft and has successfully completed the basic and advanced level courses offered by the centre. She has 2 siblings, mother is a housewife and her father owns a bicycle repair shop.

Jyoti was searching for a way to help her family out financially in light of their dire financial situation. She enrolled in the sewing and tailoring school to learn how to make clothes and to open up a source of income. Her parents were pleased with her for being able to use her talent to support her family while she was still studying.

Jyoti was given a beginning kit and a certificate after she completed her training, which generated a different energy and assisted her in becoming competent and gaining respect from her companions. Due to her skill in the job, she gradually began to get more and more orders which in turn led her to support her parents financially. She serves as an inspiration & role model to other women, to work hard, and monetize their skills.



## Vocational Training

The pandemic lockdown made it challenging to come up with new teaching and learning strategies. All types of educators—teachers, coaches, mentors, and facilitators—have adapted to employing technology. The Foundation assisted in extending support towards conducting such vocational training sessions.





## Health and Medical Care Services

### Continued Patronage to Community

In order to raise the bar for medical excellence, the Foundation has introduced mobile medical care services in 10 tribal settlements. 2,933 patients are able to utilise these services each week.

At Navneet Foundation, we truly believe that upgrading health infrastructure is essential to raising the calibre of healthcare services available to those in need.

**Supplied 8 ventilators and 16 monitors to ICU departments of 4 hospitals, saving lives of 3,545 people.**

With the thoughtful objective of promoting community happiness and wellness, the Foundation assisted in the development of a medical centre whose services span 15 different health faculties. The centre serves 180 marginalised patients every day, and as of this writing, 54,000 patients have been healed.

## Excelling in Care

### Together We Rise and Heal



The pandemic had practically taken over the entire world, and the increasing demand for patient care put a strain on all medical facilities and systems. The Foundation understood the suffering of the villagers who found it difficult to obtain such services due to lack of money and limited transportation.

During this time, it was very important to make first aid medical services accessible to villagers, and taking a step ahead in this direction, the Foundation distributed 20 first-aid kits to the community groups at large. Village level volunteers called Arogya Mitra, made this initiative successful by providing villagers access to the medical kits during the crisis.

Post pandemic, while our health infrastructure was still reviving, there was a sharp increase in the need for surgeries and medical treatments. This created a need for enhancement of infrastructure facilities.

During this time, the Foundation stepped in by providing two automatic operation tables to Sion Hospital, which helped improve quality surgical services to 2,400 patients.

Excelling in Care

Investing in Health Equity



This year, Navneet Mega Medical Camp was organized in Gujarat where about 2009 patients accessed medical services that included treatment of ailments and surgeries. Also, at another medical camp, 2,000 patients were benefitted by diagnostic and surgeries medical care and facilities.

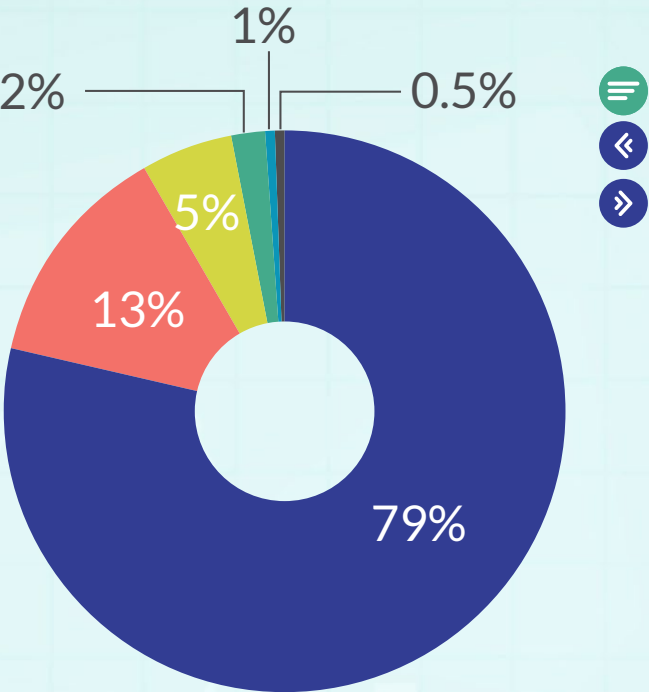
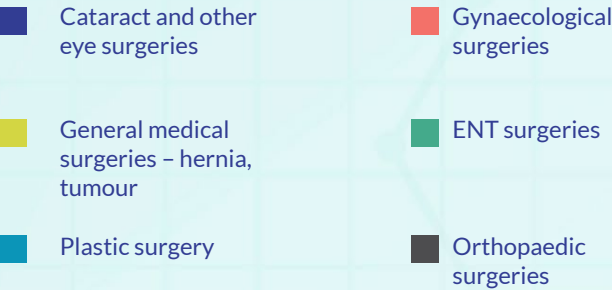

At Navneet Foundation, we strongly echo Mahatma Gandhi's belief that a country's grandeur and moral progress can be measured by how it treats and cares for its voiceless animals. Navneet Foundation supported 271

gaushalas, which offered food, housing and medical attention to all rescued and abandoned animals. More than 8,700 animals are fed and cared at these shelter homes. Large and small animals find a dignified and caring life at these shelters.

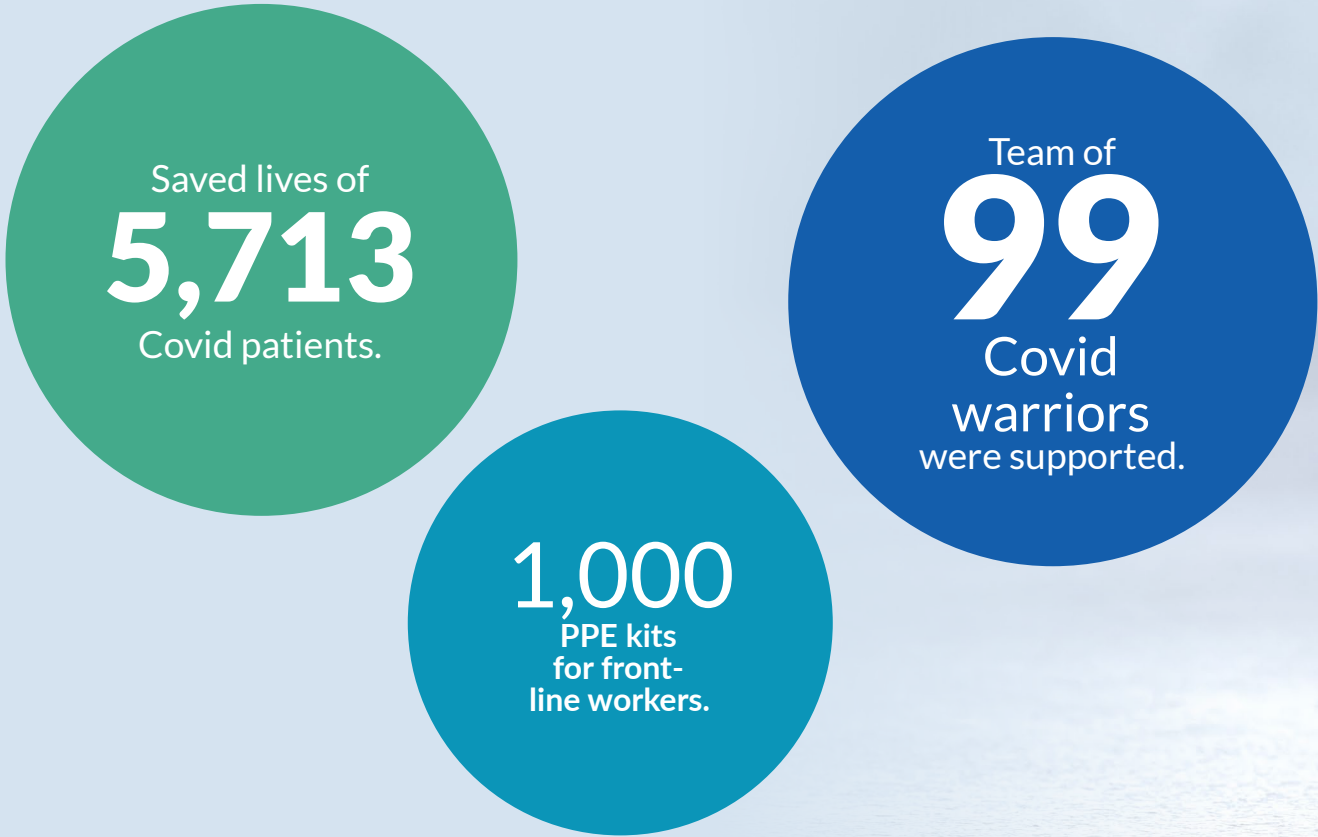
Rapid Response Team

Covid’s second wave had put India’s healthcare system under extreme strain, topped with acute oxygen shortage that made the scenario even worse. Foundation solely focussed on providing patients with oxygen concentrators and set up Covid centres with 50 and 100 bed capacities that saved lives of 5,713 Covid patients.

Support was provided to set up a team of 99 Covid warriors, who led the show from the front by providing medical care to suffering patients. PPE kits were made available for 1000 bravehearts, i.e., team of doctors and medical staff.

Seven Hills Hospital, a mega covid centre in

Mumbai, was supported with provision of 15 electric beds in ICU and 25 manual beds. These medical facilities helped and benefitted 2,085 patients. Additionally, the Foundation worked tirelessly to secure ventilators for them and a few other hospitals, which helped save the lives of 204 people. Our efforts weren’t limited to one hospital; the charity also provided assistance by filling the ICU bed shortage at Corporation Hospital in Mumbai. 500 health and sanitation kits were given to the hospital’s nurses at the same time to safeguard their own health and safety as well as to show thanks.

Disaster Management

Rapid Response Team

At a time when vaccinations were a major boon to fight Covid, their availability was a serious concern for the masses. The Foundation took a major step by providing vaccines to 270 senior citizens residing in Mumbai slums. Also, in a remote village in Bihar, with the support of local government, the Foundation helped in providing 400 medical kits with basic medicines for treatment of Covid. The Foundation also extended medical treatment to 124

Covid patients. The Foundation provided monthly food ration packages to 360 homes during the pandemic, which satisfied the hunger of 1,400 people. The Foundation also made an effort to provide assistance to small business owners who were working hard to restore their ventures affected by Covid. In the same movement, six women were assisted in resurrecting their flour mills, which helped them provide for their families.

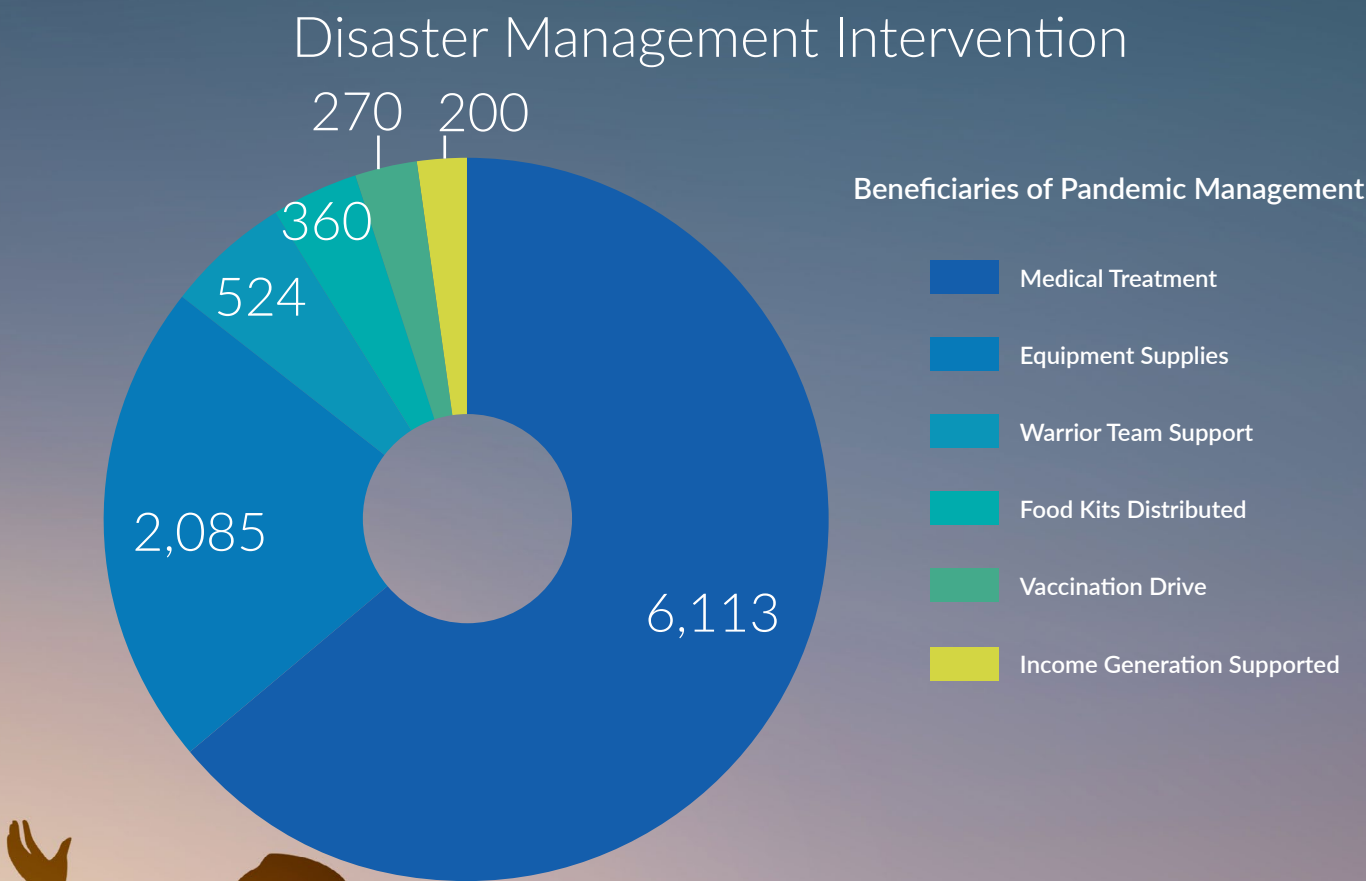

## Other Initiatives

### Environmental Conservation

The Foundation vows that preserving nature is the only route to conserving our sustenance.

Kutch, Gujarat, has been facing a water crisis since decades. Several efforts had been carried out during the year in villages to conserve rain water to help improve water levels of the ground, decrease salinity and improve soil quality for effective farming. Work of desilting was done in 9 structures in the basin area of river Rukmavati with active participation of farmers. By the end of year, around 18,269 CUM (cubic meter) capacity of soil was enhanced for water conservation for the upcoming monsoon. Simultaneously, work on pond deepening has been continuing in 17 villages, which will eventually benefit 5,594 families in Moti Rayan village.

# Other Initiatives

## Environmental Conservation



**Roof water harvesting systems were installed in 7 villages, conserving 7 lakh litres of water and giving respite to 350 families.**

The Foundation always takes every necessary step to support community development that effectively paves the way for socio-economic growth and transformation. Efforts were directed to improve the quality of life in villages like Bhekhadia and Kawant situated at the border of Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh by building 100 dams, 500 trenches and 300 farm water ditches. In addition, 100 cows were given to the tribal villagers who depend on them for their subsistence. The company has gone an extra mile and actually made efforts to resolve ground level problems of these farmers by helping them make their land free of “Gando Bawad” crop which was actually affecting plantations across the fields. The initiative has flourished development across these regions.

The company’s management has long held the view that no community development is feasible without the motivation and participation of the core communities that are impacted, since this ignites a spark in the planned activities. With the support of the community, we were able to pave 1.5 kilometres of roads in a hilly area. In order to transform these areas into water-sustainable belts, we have also promoted the cultivation of trees. For example, 10,000 mango, custard apple, jamun (Indian blackberry), and guava tree saplings were distributed in 6 villages, benefiting 750 farmers. The efforts paid off when it was noticed that farm yields and fodder have increased quadruply, thereby generating four fold income.

With immense support from villagers, 300 farms were protected from trespassing by actually fencing the fields, creating a violence free safe zone. The awareness about the noise and environmental pollution has led to adoption of more environmental friendly methods to celebrate social events without fire crackers & loud music. These small changes have resulted in the villages saving over ₹ 60,000 on festival celebrations. The Foundation has already brought smiles and hope to more than 2,000 tribes, clearly demonstrating that our initiative is a successful endeavor on social and economic parameters.

The topography and soil in the tribal communities of Vasai Virar Taluka make it difficult to get water for drinking and farming. Due to the excessive salinity of the soil in these communities, which are closer to the sea and creeks, crop production is difficult. In this area, collecting rainwater was the first step toward water conservation. In 7 villages, roof-mounted water collection

systems have been built. As a result, during the monsoon season in the villages, 7 lakh litres of water was saved at bore wells and hand pumps. 350 families have benefited from our initiative’s assistance in resolving their summertime water crisis.

This pandemic has certainly made humans realize the importance of

nature. Steps were taken to enhance nature by conducting additional plantation drives. The task of restoring the environment with the planting of 100 trees in 4 villages was taken up with participation of villagers where they have taken up the ownership of caring for the saplings to see them grow into a trees.

## Community Development

Community Halls developed for capacity of **1,250** people

Agriculture Tool Kits provided to **300** farmers.



While working with farmer communities in Vasai Virar Taluka, the Foundation became cognizant of the requirement and necessity for better agricultural working tools for the farmers. Taking a leap in this direction, more than 300 farmers from 20 villages were provided with an 'Agriculture Tool Kit' consisting of *kudal*, *favda*, *ghamela*, *vila* and others to help them work smoothly.

The Foundation is making every effort to help the underprivileged, with the sole hope to turn the distressed faces to smiling ones.

Two underprivileged people were supported for repairs and maintenance of houses helping them lead a life of dignity and peace.

While on one side the Foundation contributed towards developing community halls for a capacity of 1,250 people, that were then used to organize meetings as well as cultural fests, on the other

side, understanding the needs of senior citizens, we have supported 35 old age homes and are taking care of 883 senior people with loads of love. 187 girls in ashram school were provided with sanitary pads for use through the year. 7 homes received solar panels in a village where electricity was not accessible, as families were not able to afford electricity charges.

## Sports

Sports are crucial in helping people develop their character by instilling the resilience needed to rise up after every setback. The Foundation has provided this opportunity to underprivileged children. Cricket coaching is provided to over 320 girls and boys. Coaching is incomplete without quality equipment for practice. To encourage children to follow their aspirations and sport of their passion, each child is provided with a cricket training kit with support of the Foundation.

She then relocated to Europe with her coach to finish her training. Our company is really pleased that our efforts are producing champions who are receiving awards at national and international forums and making our nation proud.

Naishaa Kaur Bhatoye, age 14, is one of the names you will hear in the professional badminton fraternity these days. Playing competitive badminton since the age of 8, Naishaa has often been a challenge to all opponents, even those who are much older than her. Training through pandemic, a bike accident, a ligament stress, all have been a part of her in 2022, but that hasn't put her down, except for a break in training.

Being No. 1 in India in her age category, Naishaa's dream has come true. It is her desire, passion, and willingness that motivates her to fight back every single day. Her relentless efforts have helped her achieve an extra mile and that has made her DREAM COME TRUE by being India's No. 1 in her category.
